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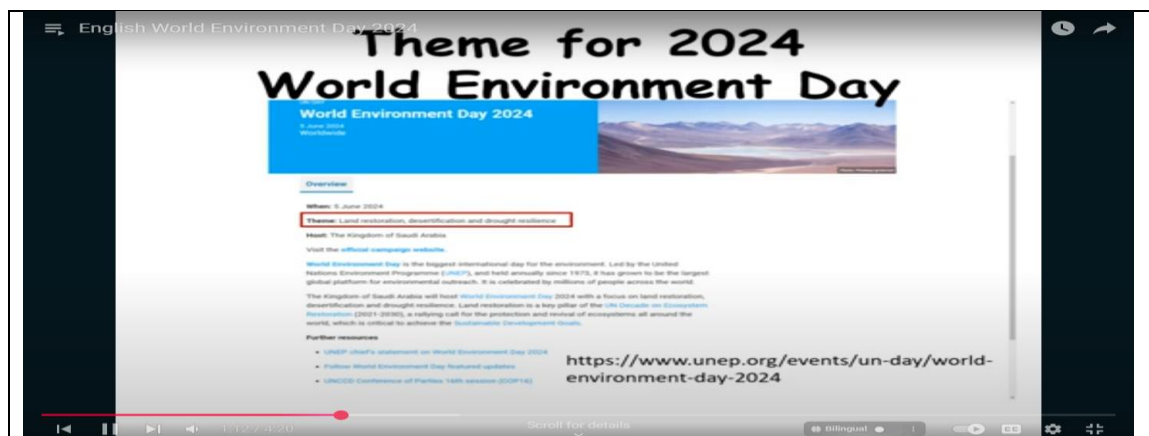

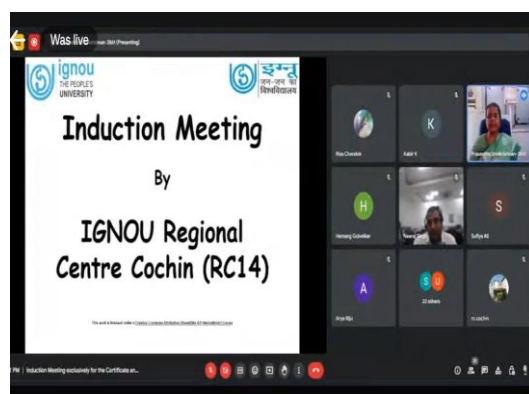
Online/Virtual Facebook Live Induction Meeting on 2nd April 2024 for learners of Certificate and Semester programmes of January 2024 session

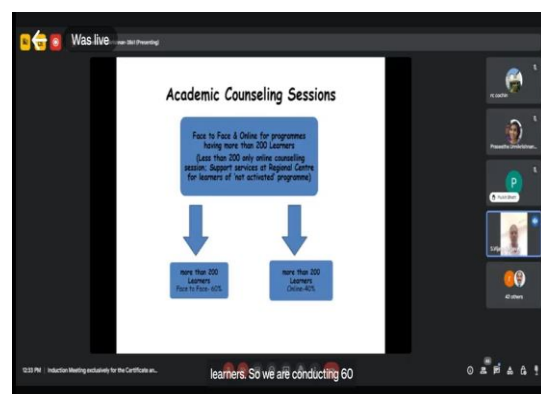

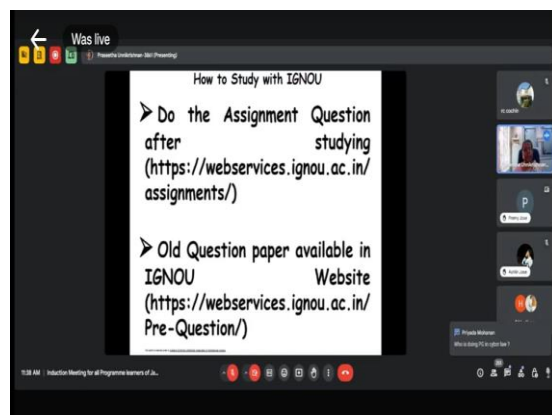

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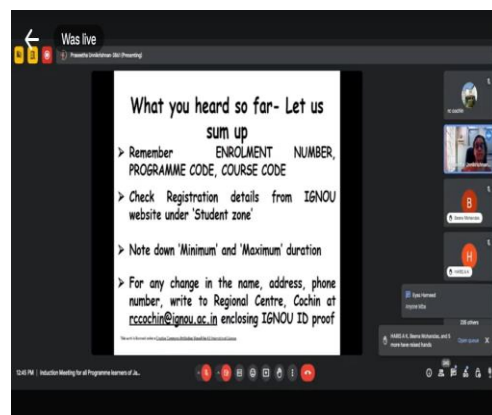

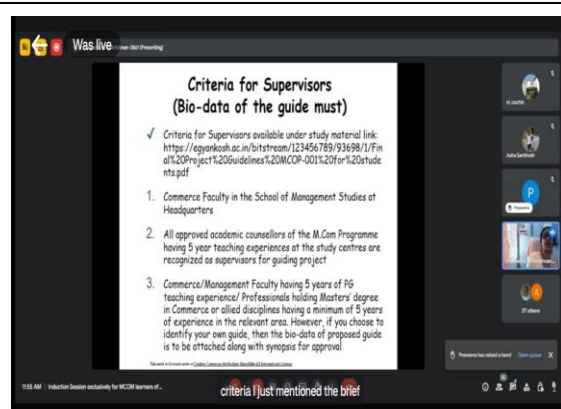
Induction Meeting for learners for MCOM programme of January 2024 admission cycle

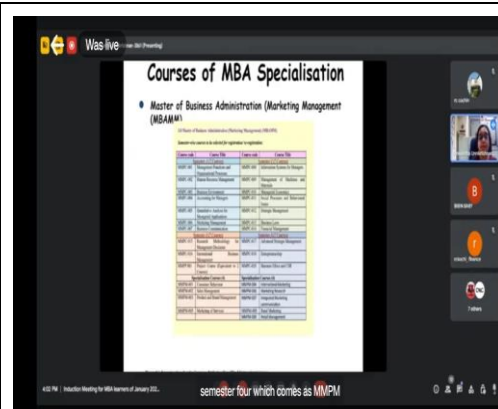

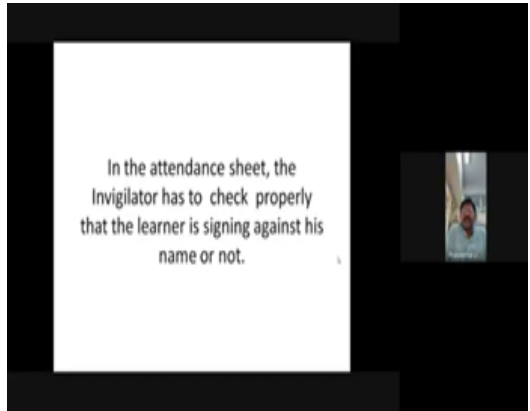

Water bird count throws up mixed results

115 species and 3,168 individuals counted during the two-day exercise; data generated to be submitted to BNHS and Wetlands International

The 2024 Asian Waterbird Census has thrown up mixed results in Ernakulam district.

While the number of water bird species spotted during the exercise marginally went up this year, the number of individuals counted plummeted to half, according to the organisers.

This year, 115 species and 3,168 individuals were counted.

However, the 2023 exercise succeeded in recording the presence of 111 species and 7,653 individuals. There were 109 species and 4,931 individuals in 2022, they noted. A lesser number of Lesser Whis-

ting Duck, a fairly common bird, was recorded this year.

Climate change

The reasons for the reduced presence of the species need to be probed. Climate change and the general decline in the ex-

tent and quality of wetlands, pollution, hindrance in the free flow of water, sedimentation, and unhealthy agricultural practices such as use of pesticides and discharge of effluents and sewage into wetlands can affect bird population. Detailed stu-

dies on water quality and steps for the restoration of the health of wetlands are required, according to the organisers.

Some of the species that were spotted during the year included Garganey, Snail Pratinoche, Black-tailed Godwit, Baillon's

Crake, Slaty-legged Crake, Marsh Sandpiper, Lesser black-backed gull, Little Tern, and Great crested tern. Spot-billed Pelican, Booted eagle, Osprey, Glossy Ibis, Common Tern, Common Redshank, and Common Greenshank were also spotted, accord-

ing to a communication.

The data generated during the two-day exercise will be submitted to the Bombay Natural History Society (BNHS) and Wetlands International, the agencies that coordinate the Wetland Bird Census in the country and at the global level, said K. Vishnu Priyan Kartha, secretary of the Cochin Natural History Society.

The Census was jointly organised by the Kerala Sasthra Sahitya Parishad Varapuzha unit and the Cochin Natural History Society. Volunteers covered wetlands in Kadamakkudy, Dewaswompadam, Puthuvype, Nedumbassery, Thripunithura, Kandakkadavu, Karumalloor, Veliyathunda, Manjall, Nedunjad, and Aniyal, they said.

REPUBLIC DAY 2024

Why it is Celebrated on January 26? History & Significance Explained

The significance of Republic Day lies in the historical journey that transformed India from a British colony into a sovereign and democratic republic.

India will celebrate 75th Republic Day on January 26 (Friday). The day marks the pivotal moment when the nation formally adopted its Constitution in 1950.

This year, the Republic Day Parade at Kartavya Path will have the theme of 'Viksit Bharat' and 'Bharat - Loktantra ki Matrakā'. French President Emmanuel Macron will be the chief guest at the Republic Day celebrations.

The 75th Republic Day celebrations at the majestic Kartavya Path will largely be "women-centric" with the central theme of India's democracy and its resolve to become a developed nation. In a first, the parade will be headed by 100 women artists with Indian musical instruments, Defence Secretary Giridhar Aramane said on Friday.

WHY JANUARY 26 WAS CHOSEN?

The history of the date goes back to the pre-independence era when the freedom fighters were struggling for independence. During the Indian National Congress session held at Lahore in 1929, the party took the resolution of Poorna Swaraj or complete independence. Congress declared to observe January 26, 1930 as the total independence or Purna Swaraj Day.

Thus, on January 26, 1930, the Indian National Congress, led by Mahatma Gandhi, declared 'Purna Swaraj' or complete independence. This proclamation marked a significant moment in India's quest for self-determination and set the stage for a future that would be shaped by the principles of democracy and sovereignty.

REPUBLIC DAY: HISTORY

The Constituent Assembly was the body meant to draft the Constitution of India. It held its first session on December 9, 1946, attended by 207 members, including nine women. Initially, the assembly had 389 members, however after independence and the partition of the country, on August 15, 1947, the strength was reduced to 299.

The Drafting Committee led by Dr. B.R. Ambedkar was one among the over 17 committees of the Constituent Assembly. The Drafting Committee's task was to prepare a Draft Constitution for India. The committee got rid of about 2,480 amendments while debating and deliberating the constitution, out of nearly 7,600 amendments tabled.

The last session of the Constituent Assembly ended on November 26, 1949, and that is when the Constitution was adopted. However, it came into effect two months later after the signatures of the 284 members on January 26, 1950, because of the significance of the day.

REPUBLIC DAY PARADE



For the first time, the parade will commence with music played using Indian musical instruments by 100 women artists, instead of the military band as was earlier, according to the defence secretary.

A 144 personnel tri-service women contingent would be participating in the parade this time for the first time with 48 personnel from each service. Also, the Indian Air Force's (IAF) latest induction, the C-295 medium transport aircraft, will make debut over Kartavya Path during the fly-past.

All the cultural performances will be by women, around 1,300, the highest number of performers ever. In addition, around 13,000 achievers in various fields and those who excelled through various government schemes will be special invitees at the parade.

A 65-member marching contingent and 33-member band contingent from France will also take part in the parade. Along with the aircraft of the Indian Air Force, one Multi Role Tanker Transport (MRTT) aircraft and two Rafale aircraft of the French Air Force will participate in the fly-past, the Defence Secretary said.

WHEN AND WHERE TO WATCH?

The Republic Day Parade can be watched from the stands on Kartavya Path, New Delhi. The tickets can be bought online till 25 January 2024 at the Ministry of Defence's official website. The total seating capacity at the celebrations will be 77,000 out of which 42,000 seats are being reserved for the general public.

The parade will start at 10:30 hours and run for a duration of approximately 90 minutes. Those interested can tune into it live from the comfort of their homes on state-run channels such as Doordarshan and Sansad TV. Other regional and national news channels will also air the parade live.

Nowadays, the students and teachers of CMS College, Kottayam, are not the only ones who are discovering the joys that their grand old campus offers. The 200-year-old institution, a blend of colonial and traditional Kerala architectural style constructions, is now emerging as a major academic tourist destination with a steady stream of visitors, including foreigners, exploring its history and heritage and studying its transformative journey spanning over two centuries. The visiting public are also allowed to

get a first-hand experience of the knowledge-based materials and other intellectual assets.

Varghese C. Joshua, Principal, says the campus, with its green open spaces, heritage buildings and other academic facilities, has also landed in the radar of a few international tour

agencies. "Over the past seven to eight months alone, the campus has received an average of 150-200 visitors every month. The majority of the foreign guests comes here as part of their academic projects. It is against this backdrop that we decided to blend these two concepts to launch an

academic tourism programme," he says.

Among the key attractions on the campus are a sprawling botanic garden comprising 1,650 plant varieties, seven heritage buildings that are two centuries old, a huge aquarium, a sculpture park, besides a museum that showcases the history of Indian printing technology.

The autonomous institution, founded in 1817, is one of the first colleges in India. Its first Principal, Benjamin Bailey, was instrumental in developing the Malayalam typeset that led to a modernisation of Malayalam script and universalisation of public instruction.

The college authorities have set up a group of student tour guides and staff coordinators. "The campus will be open to guests on all Saturdays and Sundays, besides public holidays. Individuals or groups who are keen on visiting the place may book their slots on the college website," adds Mr. Joshua.

Nina Thomas, a faculty member with the Mar Theophilus Training College in Thiruvananthapuram, who recently visited the college along with a 14-member group of BED students, says one of the main reasons why she would take in more student groups to the campus is its great

academic atmosphere. "We wanted the students to get a glimpse of an education system that existed in the past. What we found there, however, is a transition of the country's education system from the old to the modern that spans two centuries," she said.

Aleena Ann Saju, a teacher with NSM CMS Lower Primary School in Moolendam, recently led two student groups to the campus. It is not like taking the students to an anonymous destination - the students and staff of the college are friendly, she says. "For the children, everything on the campus is exciting - the aquarium, the old printing press units and even the green open spaces," she adds.
