The Constitution day which is also known as the 'Samvidhan Divas' is celebrated on 26th November every year to commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India to promote Constitution values among citizens. The day honours the Constitution Assembly's Vision in drafting the Constitution and Dr. B. R. Ambedkar's pivotal role as Chairman of the Drafting Committee earning him the title of 'Father of the Indian Constitution'.

On this day, Hon'ble Prime Minister of India joined the celebrations organised by the Supreme Court of India marking 75 years since adoption of the Indian Constitution. The 'Hamara Samvidhan, Hamara Samman' campaign launched on 24th January, 2024 aims to deepen citizens' understanding of the Constitution and its role in shaping Indian society. The campaign includes regional events, workshops and seminars alongwith sub-campaigns like Sabko Nyay, Har Ghar Nyay, Nav Bharat, Nav Sankalp and Vidhi Jagriti Abhiyan and to align with India's vision of a developed Nation by 2047.

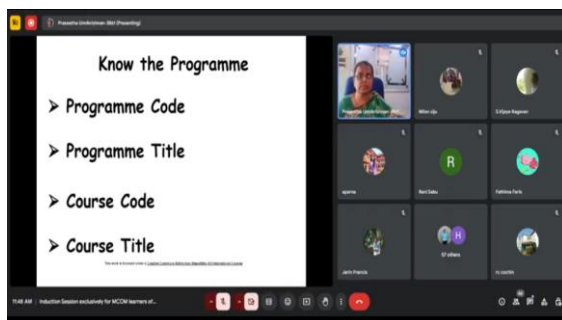

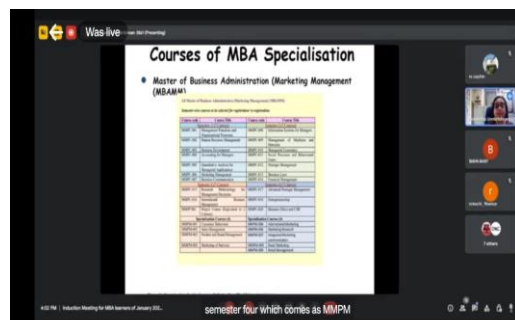
Induction Meeting for July 2024 session

Overall three Induction Meetings for July 2024 session has been conducted through online platform for effective Student Support Services at IGNOU Regional Centre Cochin.

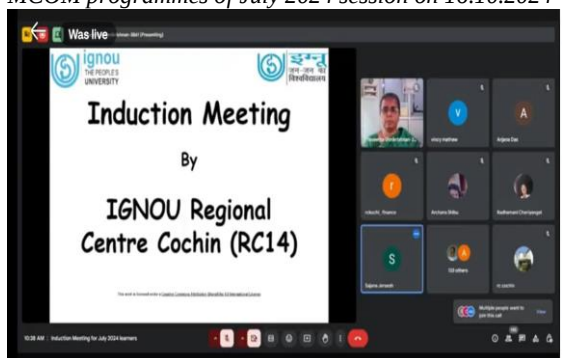

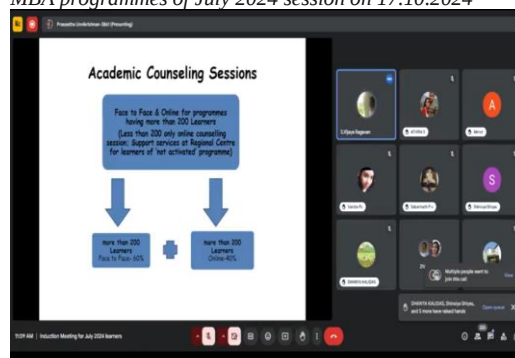

Innovation Club Activity

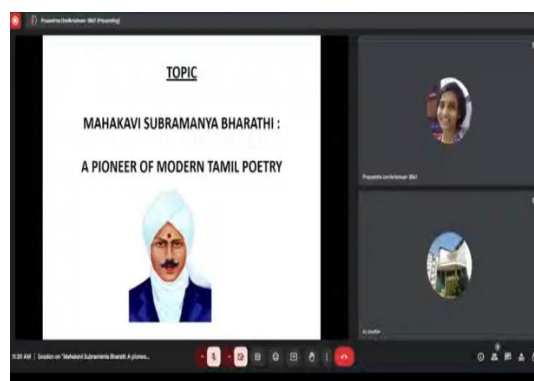

Promotional initiatives

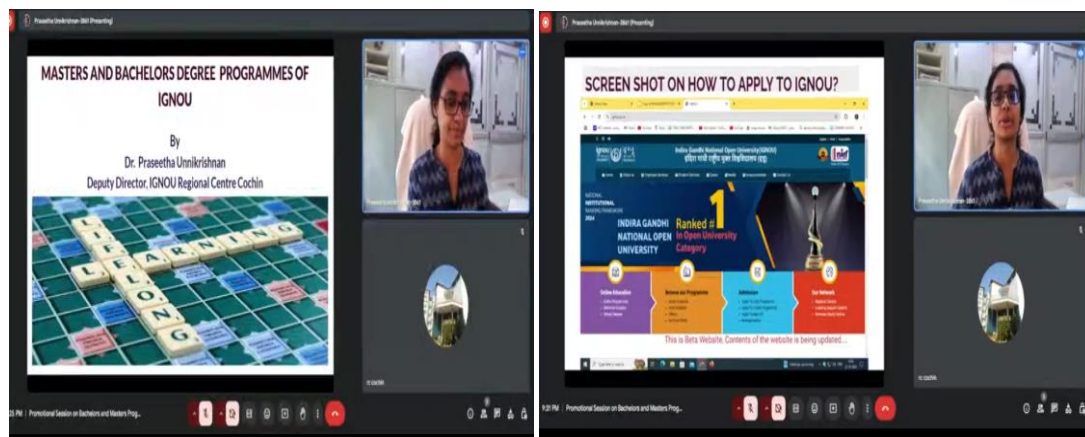

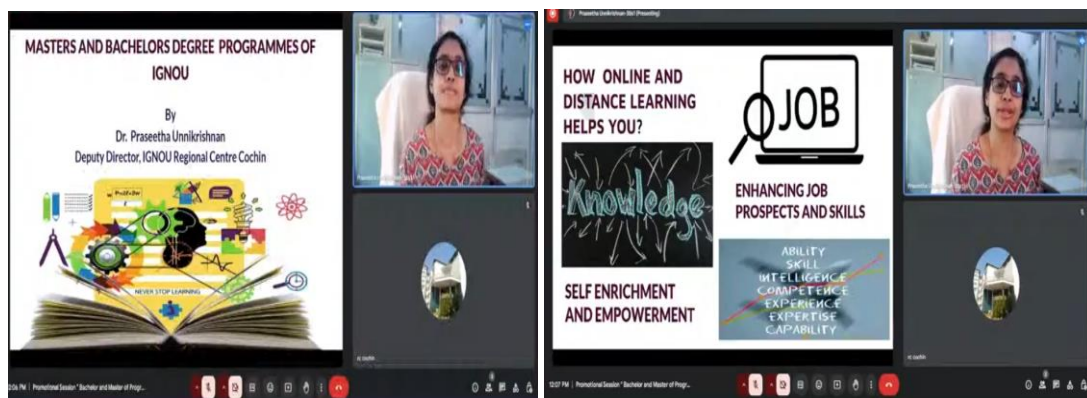

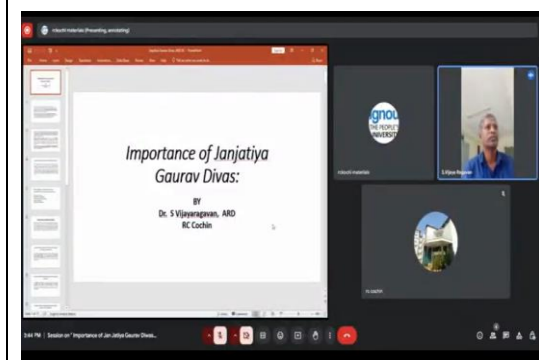

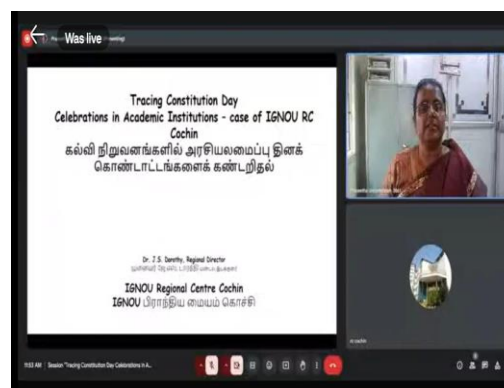

A distinct place for the Hanuman Plover

Wetland scientists and ornithologists have finally confirmed the presence in Kerala of the recently identified shorebird species which takes its name from the monkey god Hanuman of the epic Ramayana.

Hanuman Plover (*Charadrius seebohmi*) was spotted and photographed in the Kadalundi Bird Sanctuary on February 2, 2019 for the first time in Kerala and for the second time on the Kappad beach on January 20, 2024 by ornithologist Abdulla Paleri, also an Assistant Professor in Zoology at Silver Arts and Science College, Perambra, Kozhikode. Taej Mundkur

of the Wetlands International, Sampath Seneviratne of Colombo University, and Andrew Baksh, a shorebird expert from the U.S., confirmed the identification of the bird. This was also mentioned in *Bionotes*, a quarterly newsletter, last week.

Dr. Paleri said that in the 1930s, Kentish Plover (*Charadrius alexandrinus*), a shorebird in Eurasia and North Africa and a winter visitor to India, and Hanuman Plover were merged into a single species. "Thanks to the morphological and DNA studies conducted by scientists from the U.K. and Sri Lanka the two species have been split and Hanuman Plover got elevated into the species rank in April 2023," he

said. He said that Dr. Seneviratne, who confirmed the present sighting, is the co-author of the "split" paper published in the *Ibis* journal in April 2023.

Endemic bird

Hanuman Plover has been found in Sri Lanka and South India but not reported from Kerala so far. "It is a regional endemic bird that was recently found to be

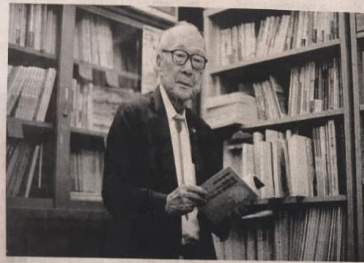
breeding in the Gulf of Mannar," Dr. Paleri said.

The name Hanuman Plover was given to the bird by scientists because of its distribution in Sri Lanka and South India. Hanuman Plover has a smaller wing, beak, and tail in comparison with its relative Kentish Plover. Further, its feet is greyish black and that of Kentish is dark. Besides, the head of the male Hanuman Plover has a distinct black stripe on its forehead, missing it in Kentish Plover.

Alex Bond, who co-authored the *Ibis* paper on the split of Hanuman Plover, says: "While we don't know if Hanuman Plover is threatened at the moment, it lives in an area which has one of the highest human population densities on the planet."

Japanese atomic bomb survivors' group wins Nobel Peace Prize

The Nobel Peace Prize was awarded Friday to Nihon Hidankyo, a Japanese organisation of survivors of the US atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, for its activism against nuclear weapons.

The grassroots movement received the prize "for demonstrating through witness testimony that nuclear weapons must never be used again," the Oslo-based Norwegian Nobel Committee said in a statement. Next year will mark 80 years since two American atomic bombs killed an estimated 120,000 inhabitants of Hiroshima and Nagasaki in Japan.

Jorgen Watne Frydnes, chair of the Norwegian Nobel Committee, said the award was made as the "taboo against the use of nuclear weapons is under pressure." Last month, Russian President

Vladimir Putin announced a shift in his country's nuclear doctrine, in a move aimed at discouraging the West from allowing Ukraine to strike Russia with longer-range weapons.

Watne Frydnes said the Nobel committee "wishes to honour all survivors who, despite physical suffering and painful memories, have chosen to use their costly experience to cultivate hope and engagement for peace."

Hidankyo's Hiroshima branch chairperson, Tomoyuki Mimaki, who was standing by at the city hall for the announcement, cheered and teared up when he received the news.

Efforts to eradicate nuclear weapons have been honoured before by the Nobel committee. The International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons won the peace prize in 2017, and in 1995 Joseph Rotblat and the Pugwash Conferences on

Science and World Affairs won for "their efforts to diminish the part played by nuclear arms in international politics and, in the longer run, to eliminate such arms." This year's prize was awarded against a backdrop of devastating conflicts raging in West Asia, Ukraine, and Sudan. "It is very clear that threats of using nuclear weapons are putting pressure on the important international norm, the taboo of using nuclear weapons," Watne Frydnes said in response to a question on whether the rhetoric from Russia surrounding nuclear weapons in its invasion of Ukraine had influenced this year's decision. "And therefore it is alarming to see how threats of use is also damaging this norm. To uphold an international strong taboo against the use is crucial for all of humanity," he added.

Last year's prize went to jailed Iranian

activist Narges Mohammadi for her advocacy of women's rights and democracy, and against the death penalty. The Nobel committee said it also was a recognition of "the hundreds of thousands of people" who demonstrated against "Iran's theocratic regime's policies of discrimination and oppression targeting women." In a year of conflict, there had been some speculation that the Norwegian Nobel Committee that decides on the winner would opt not to award a prize at all. The prize has been withheld 19 times since 1901, including during both world wars.

In West Asia, spiralling levels of violence in the past year have killed tens of thousands of people, including women and children. The war in Ukraine, sparked by Russia's invasion, is heading toward its third winter with a massive loss of human life on both sides.
